The Mission Oaks Computer Club celebrated its 21st Anniversary in October, 2009. The club meets at the Mission Oaks Community Center at 4701 Gibbons Drive in Carmichael on the 2nd Thursday of each month from 1 to 3 p.m. The club has nearly 80 members most of whom are seniors and is open to all adults in the Sacramento region regardless of age. The club is particularly interested in attracting the newly retired along with anyone with an interest in computers.

The monthly general meeting features a different computer-related program. Future programs will include subjects ranging from Microsoft Windows 7, Using on-line bill pay websites, computer technology in today's automobiles, getting the best from your digital camera, and much more. Most community/senior publications in the area list our meetings in their calendar sections.

A problem solving clinic follows each general meeting Individual computer problems are addressed by Adam Lacey of Applications, Etc. from 3-4 p.m.

The membership includes a broad range of computer competence from absolute beginners to fairly sophisticated long-term users. The general meetings are set up with chairs and a projector facing a screen. The Mission Oaks Community Center offers wireless internet access.

First-time visitors are always welcome as are prospective members and presenters.

The club maintains three Special Interest Groups (SIGs): Basic Computing/Internet, Digital Imaging & Editing, Bits 'n Bytes (a collection of different subjects) and the Problem Solving Clinic. These groups are moderated by interested club members with member discussion and input encouraged.
